

Key Points from the Sermon “No Other Gospel”

Galatians 1:1-10

1. Introduction to Galatians

5. Modern Distortions of the Gospel

- The prosperity gospel and the belief that everyone goes to heaven are examples of modern distortions of the true gospel.
- Paul's message reminds us that salvation is through faith in Christ alone, not through worldly pursuits or self-centered living.

6. The Danger of Legalism and Sin

- Celebrating sin or adhering to legalism contradicts the gospel's call to holiness and transformation.
- True freedom in Christ involves turning away from sin, not using grace as a license to continue in it.

7. The Reality of Hell

- The sermon affirms the biblical teaching of hell as a real and literal place, emphasizing the seriousness of rejecting the gospel.

8. Historical Stand for the Gospel

- The Protestant Reformation, led by figures like Martin Luther, echoes Paul's defense of the gospel in Galatians.
- The truth of the gospel must be upheld even when it faces opposition.

9. Call to Action

- Christians are urged to hold fast to the true gospel, resist diluting it for acceptance, and live out the gospel in all aspects of life.
- The sermon concludes with a prayer for strength, discernment, and faithfulness in witnessing the gospel.
