

Introduction:

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2. Jesus's Eternal Priesthood (Hebrews 7:24-25)

- **Permanent Role:** Because Jesus lives forever, He offers an unchanging priesthood. His resurrection and eternal life guarantee His continual intercession for us.
 - **Sufficient Sacrifice:** Unlike the old priests who needed to offer sacrifices repeatedly, Jesus's one perfect sacrifice covers all sins for all time.
 - **Our Assurance:** This permanence means our relationship with God is secure. We don't have to rely on human efforts or temporary systems for fulfillment or reconciliation with God.
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3. The Perfect High Priest (Hebrews 7:26-28)

- **Character of Jesus:** Jesus is holy, blameless, and pure—set apart from sinners and exalted above the heavens. This sets Him apart from any other priest in history.
- **A Complete Sacrifice:** Jesus offered Himself once for all, making any further sacrifices unnecessary. His sinlessness and sacrifice meet our deepest spiritual needs.
- **Application:** We are invited to live in freedom, knowing our sins are fully and finally atoned for. There's no more need for rituals or efforts to earn forgiveness—Jesus has done it all.

4. Living in the Confidence of Christ's Sacrifice

- **Freedom and Assurance:** Jesus's once-for-all sacrifice frees us from guilt, shame, and fear. We are forgiven, redeemed, and restored through His work.
- **Reflect:** Think of a time when you experienced true forgiveness or freedom. Jesus offers a freedom that is eternal and unchanging.
- **Practical Example:** The story of a man whose debt was paid in full illustrates the complete relief and freedom Jesus's sacrifice offers. Our spiritual debt is paid—forever.
